A Message From Ron Becker

Dear friends,

As we look ahead to the summer season, we take pride in completing a very productive and fulfilling year at the JCC culminating in our celebration in the month of June of the holiday of Yom Yerushalayim (Jerusalem Unification Day) and the festival of Shavuot. Glancing back on the year we have completed, we observed together the High Holy Days, Sukkot and all the many holidays and other special occasions that followed. We celebrated milestone birthdays, anniversaries, a Bar Mitzvah and baby namings and shared wonderful community Shabbat dinners every month with much singing, comradery, and Shabbat spirit in addition to the sumptuous meals. And with only one or two exceptions, we had a minyan every Shabbat morning and during the week when one of our members (including myself) was observing a Yahrzeit. In addition, we marched together and participated in the Martin Luther King Day program at the historic Booker Washington School and honored our beloved president, Eileen Hochstadt as our Woman of Distinction.

We were especially fortunate to complete another great year of study in our adult education classes which included weekly sessions at which we discussed the Jewish life cycle events and the Hebrew calendar events. More people participated than ever and I learned much from our congregants and friends.

Unfortunately, we have also shared some sadder times including illnesses more than our share of funerals, unveilings, and Shiva minyanim at our friends' homes. We hosted a memorial service to help the healing after the tragic killings at the Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh and partnered with our friends from local churches and the Islamic Center of New Port Richey in solidarity to fight hatred whenever tragedy struck.

All of this points out that we are truly a community and as a community, we support each other, our families, and those in our midst. Without community, we are only individuals. While it is very important to express one's individuality and certainly possible to study and pray by oneself, it is the community that brings us together and provides true meaning to our lives as Jews and as citizens. We are only a fraction of what we were a few decades ago, but we are growing slowly but steadily and providing a community for us all.

Summertime often means vacation trips and extended visits with family and friends. In our case, all three of our grandsons will be spending the summer with us and then in late July and early August, we embark on our annual trip to the beach in Delaware to be with our old college buddies and their families for the 49th consecutive year. What a great tradition now shared with two younger generations! Since summertime often means violent thunderstorms and possible hurricanes here in Florida, it is also a time to prepare for them and drive safely when vacationing. So Chris and I wish you all a very happy summer and look forward to an equally fulfilling year to come.
